# Coronavirus: an open letter from scientists to say UK virus strategy is 'risking lives'

This week, scientists have written to the government assessing the risks it is taking by not taking more drastic measures to tackle the spread of Covid-19. In an open letter, the experts in science, mathematics, and genetics say the UK's current approach will put the NHS under additional stress and "risk many more lives than necessary".

So far, 3,280 people have been positively diagnosed with coronavirus and there have been 144 deaths. It is crucial to keep safe and stay away from gatherings and to follow the <u>government</u>, <u>NHS</u> and <u>WHO rules</u>. ## Microsoft Bing team launches COVID-19 tracker

The Microsoft Bing team have launched a web portal for tracking coronavirus (COVID-19) infections across the globe.

The <u>COVID-19 tracker</u> is easy to use and shows up-to-date infection statistics for each country around the globe and all the US states through an interactive world map. It also feeds real-time news related to the virus cases worldwide. Data is generated from the World Health Organization (WHO), the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC).

### LVMH to relieve French hospitals from the monstrous lack of hand sanitizers

To help hospitals in fighting the coronavirus outbreak in France, the luxury group LVMH is going to produce hand sanitiser at three of its perfume and cosmetics factories. Twelve tonnes should be produced this week (instead of the usual scents and make-up made at the three French sites). The group said the gel would be delivered "at no charge" to French health authorities, in particular, the 39 public hospitals in Paris, the group said on Sunday.

Each year Tech Nation monitors the growth of the tech sector and provides information about opportunities and challenges.
