How to clean your computer keyboard

- 1. Turn off and unplug your computer

- 3. Dampen a cotton bud with water or 70% rubbing alcohol, making sure it's not too wet. Then use it to clean the areas between the keys
- 4. Dampen a lint-free cloth with your choice of cleaning product and wipe it over the rest of the keyboard (again making sure the cloth is not too wet)

To protect against the spread of coronavirus and other diseases, experts have advised the public to clean their phones twice a day; once at lunch and again before dinner.

How to clean your phone

- 1. Unplug any cables and turn off your phone before you clean it
- 2. Use a soft lint-free cloth (like one you would clean a pair of glasses with) and dampen it in warm soapy water. You can also use a 70% rubbing alcohol wipe to clean the screen, keyboard or any other external surface
- 3. Don't get any liquid in the openings and obviously don't submerge your phone in a cleaning product (we have to say this just to be sure)
